## President's Report

We have much currently happening at The Wells as a number of projects are at or very near completion. The new LED lights have been installed at the mail area and installation is scheduled for next week in the pool ramada area. This will be a vast improvement over our current lighting capabilities and should save us money in the long run.

The new multi-use court has now been lined for pickleball and is seeing almost daily use. This is a much needed and anticipated addition to our recreation options. A further option in the way of a turf putting green is in and will be functional in the next couple of days.

Water pressure checks are now under way and so far are showing a minimum of problems with pressures a few pounds higher than before the pressure valves were replaced. You will be notified of verifiable leaks at your property in the next couple of weeks. Some of you may already have been told of problems.

In casual observation during these checks, there have been some notices of rodent activity. As Mike monitors and refills bait boxes, it is still imperative that home owners clean up their property and pick up dead fruit off the ground. This is very critical now that fruit is ripening and apt to fall from the trees and litter a yard.

We are also getting complaints about pet droppings and unleashed dogs in areas of the community. Remember you are responsible for the behavior of your pets and required to clean up after them as well.

Lastly, the scheduled board meeting for Tuesday, Feb. 4th has been cancelled due to the election. Instead the Board will hold a "work session" with the finance committee to revise and extend the 10 year plan on Tuesday, Feb. 11th. The **next monthly meeting will be on Wednesday, Feb. 19th at 7:00 pm.** At this meeting we will be installing two new board members and a quorum is required so I do urge you to, set that date and time aside and attend. **Thank you!**

If you are painting, attach a sample of the colors you selected. There is a color book in the HOA Office that contains approved colors. It also contains approved colors for driveways and planter boxes. If you have any questions when filling out the ARC form, contact one of the ARC members for assistance. If you are doing any remodeling on the outside of your house, attach a drawing of your plan along with the dimensions. You **must** wait for approval before you begin the work. Then post the yellow copy of the form on the front window of your house until the work is completed.

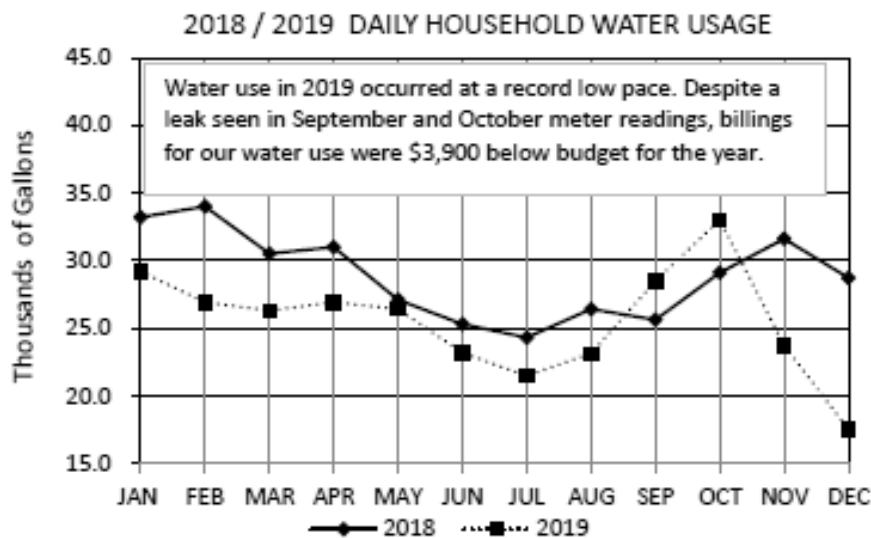
