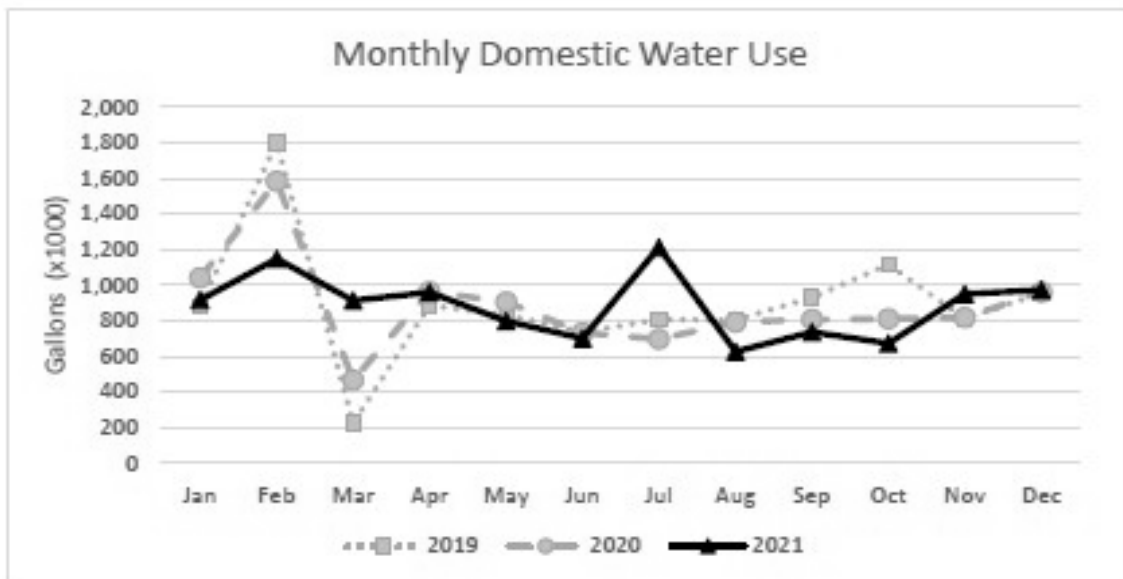

Demographic Report for Beginning of 2022

There are 422 homes at The Wells. The demographics I will be sharing will be for 364 homes which does not include the seasonal rentals (422-58 rentals). I will be using the term "snowbirds" to indicate part time residents.

How many people live at The Wells? 537.

What is the average age for: Men? 75. Women? 74.

When talking about the homes (not the number of people), what percentage of homes do you think are occupied by "snowbirds"? 53% .

What percentage of the homes are occupied full time? 47%

What % of the people are "Snowbirds"? 61% . Full time? 39%.

What % of the residents are Men? 42% Women? 58%.

Ages: Males range from 55 to 95. Females range from 46 to 98.

Snowbirds come from 26 states and 6 Canadian Provinces.

The state with the most snowbirds is Minnesota with 93. Next is Iowa with 41, Wisconsin: 32, Washington: 27, Canada: 27, North Dakota : 21.

There were 45 homes that changed hands this past year.

Our annual Memorial Service honors residents who have passed away during the past year. The first year was 2002. In our programs we honored between 10 and 28 each year. In 2020 we honored 16 and in 2021 the number was 11. The average is 17 per year.
