HOA President's Report

Most of you have heard about the incident that occurred on Saturday, January 20th at the West parking lot. There was a mechanical failure while the city dump truck was in the process of dumping one of our garbage bins. This resulted in a hydraulic spill. Mesa Fire, Police & Solid Waste Response teams all quickly responded and the fire was quickly put out. There was some concern that the hydraulic fluid would enter the Storm sewers on Mohave Drive directly West of the incident. The Solid Waste Response team did a great job of protecting the sewer system. Some additional cleanup was required on Monday.

We are finally seeing some progress for the landscaping project at the NE corner of the Clubhouse. After several different ideas and input from the Community a plan has been selected and is being implemented. We should see completion by the end of the month.

We will continue to ask everyone to respect your neighbors and avoid any loud noises from 10 PM till 6 AM per Mesa's guidelines. This includes any large items being thrown into the dumpsters during these over night hours.

And a few final reminders: the Tuesday morning BOD meeting is moved to February 13th @ 8:30 AM due to the upcoming election. The \$4.00 monthly general assessment increase will take effect on March 1st. We are looking for someone or a group to coordinate the selling of The Wells tee & polo shirts. 
