The finances of The Wells HOA continue to be in excellent condition and we continue to closely monitor them throughout the year. Capital reserve funds are used for major expense like street replacement, water line repair, etc.

Operational Reserve funds are to be used only in a financial or environmental emergency. The objective is to maintain at least a minimum balance of three months operating expense, estimated to be \$160,000.

WATER CONSERVATION

Water usage at the Wells continues to hold below monthly average. Please continue to use good judgment when using water to keep our cost down. The August water bill showed daily usage at 31.9 K (thousand) gal/ per day
